



INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, to which the Democratic Executive Committee (the Committee) agreed, solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with certain requirements included in Ohio Rev. Code Sections 3517.1012, 3517.13(X)(1), 2(b), (3)(a), and (4), 3517.17, and 3517.18, for the year ended December 31, 2011. The Committee is responsible for complying with these requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements and applicable attestation engagement standards included in the Comptroller General of the United States' *Government Auditing Standards*. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Cash Receipts

- 1. We inquired of the Committee whether they deposited all gifts from corporations, labor organizations and all gifts restricted to operations into the same fund into which they deposit amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner. Management informed us they received no such gifts.
- 2. We footed each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.17 requires (Deposit Form 31-CC), filed for 2011. We noted no computational errors.
- 3. We compared bank deposits reflected in 2011 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in Deposit Forms 31-CC filed for 2011. The bank deposit amounts agreed to the deposits recorded in the Form.
- 4. We scanned the Committee's 2011 bank statements and noted it did not reflect four quarterly payments received from the State Tax Commissioner pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code 3517.17(A).
 - The Office of Budget and Management (OMB) requires that entities submit an IRS Form W-9 in order to receive payment. Per inquiry with the Treasurer, Lynn Burke, on March 15, 2012, the Committee had not filed the required W-9 form in order to receive the first three quarter's receipts.
 - The Committee should contact the OBM and follow up on action to receive the January, April and July 2011 payments.
- 5. We scanned other recorded 2011 receipts for evidence that a corporation or labor organization may have exceeded the \$10,000 annual gift limit Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(3)(a) imposes. We found no evidence that any corporation or labor organization exceeded this limit.

Cash Reconciliation

1. We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the December 31, 2011 reconciliation for the bank account used for receipts and disbursements restricted pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(A). We found no computational errors.

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2. We agreed the bank balance on the reconciliation to the bank statement balance as of December 31, 2011. The balances did not agree. The bank statement balance was \$1,158.44 and the balance per the check register and the Finance Report was \$1,204.41. This variance of \$45.97 is the result of a transaction in the check register being report as both a disbursement and a deposit. However, the bank statement only reflected this transaction as a transfer out of the restricted fund account into the unrestricted fund savings account.

If this money should be part of the restricted account it should be transferred back from the savings account. If the money should not be returned to the restricted account an adjustment should be made to the check register to correct this variance.

Cash Disbursements

1. We footed each *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B) filed for 2011. We noted no computational errors.

Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.17(A)(2) states that a political party shall file disbursement statements as required by division (B) of section 3517.1012 of the Revised Code. Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.10(C)(6)(b) states the Secretary of State shall prescribe the form for all statements required to be filed under this section. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 3517.18 and 3517.1012 the Committee is required to use the *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* Form (Deposit Form 31-M) to report all expenditures.

The Committee should use the *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* Form (Deposit Form 31-M) to report expenditures from the restricted fund.

- Per Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(1), we scanned Disbursement Form 31-B filed for 2011 and inquired of management whether they transferred any cash from the restricted fund to any other political party account into which contributions may be made or from which contributions or expenditures may be made. We found no evidence of prohibited transfers.
- 3. We compared the amounts on checks or other disbursements reflected in 2011 restricted fund bank statements to disbursement amounts reported on Disbursement Forms 31-B filed for 2011. We found no discrepancies.
- 4. For each disbursement on Disbursement Forms 31-B filed for 2011, we traced the payee and amount to payee invoices and to the payee's name on canceled checks. The payees and amounts recorded on Disbursement Forms 31-B agreed to the payees and amounts on the canceled checks and invoices.
- 5. We scanned the payee for each 2011 disbursement for evidence that it might represent a contribution or campaign-related disbursement, both of which Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(2)(b) prohibit. We found no evidence that any restricted fund disbursements represented contributions or campaign-related disbursements.
- 6. We compared the signature on 2011 checks to the list of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. The signatory on all checks we selected was an approved signatory. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check without exception.
- 7. We scanned each 2011 restricted fund disbursement recorded on Form 31-B for evidence that it represented a transfer from the restricted fund to any other state or county political party, which Ohio Rev. Code 3517(X)(4) prohibits. We found no evidence of any transfers.

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8. We compared the purpose of each disbursement listed on 2011 Disbursement Forms 31-B to the purpose listed on the vendor invoice and to the purposes Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18 permits. We found no instances where the purpose described on the invoice violated the restrictions of Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18.

OFFICIALS' RESPONSE: We did not receive a response from Officials to the exceptions noted above.

We were not engaged to, and did not examine each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* and *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* filed for 2011, the objective of which would have been to opine on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.
