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INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, to which the Huron County Republican Executive Committee, Huron County, Ohio (the Committee), agreed, solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with certain requirements included in Ohio Rev. Code Sections 3517.1012, 3517.13(X)(1), 2(b), (3)(a), and (4), 3517.17, and 3517.18, for the year ended December 31, 2011. The Committee is responsible for complying with these requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements and applicable attestation engagement standards included in the Comptroller General of the United States' *Government Auditing Standards*. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Cash Receipts

1. We inquired of the Committee whether they deposited all gifts from corporations, labor organizations and all gifts restricted to operations into the same fund into which they deposit amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner. Management informed us they received no such gifts.
2. Pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.7, *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* (Deposit Form 31-CC) is to be used for any deposits into the Political Party Restricted Fund. The Committee incorrectly used *Statement of Contributions Received* (Deposit Form 31-A) to report deposits into the Political Party Restricted Fund. We footed each *Statement of Contributions Received* (Deposit Form 31-A), filed for 2011. We noted no computational errors. We recommend the Committee use the correct Form 31-CC.
3. We compared bank deposits reflected in 2011 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in Deposit Forms 31-A filed for 2011. The bank deposit amounts agreed to the deposits recorded in the Form.
4. We scanned the Committee's 2011 bank statements and noted they reflected four quarterly payments received from the State Tax Commissioner pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.17(A). The Deposit Forms 31-A reported the sum of these four payments without exception.
5. We scanned other recorded 2011 receipts for evidence that a corporation or labor organization may have exceeded the \$10,000 annual gift limit Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.13(X)(3)(a), imposes. We found no evidence that any corporation or labor organization exceeded this limit.

Cash Reconciliation

1. We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the December 31, 2011 reconciliation for the bank account used for receipts and disbursements restricted pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.1012(A). We found no computational errors.
2. We agreed the bank balance on the reconciliation to the bank statement balance as of December 31, 2011. The balances agreed.
3. We agreed all reconciling items appearing on the reconciliation to canceled checks. We determined that the dates and amounts on those documents support that those items were proper reconciling items and were recorded in the proper amount on the reconciliation as of December 31, 2011.

Cash Disbursements

1. Pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.17, *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* (Form 31-M) is to be used for any disbursement from the Political Party Restricted Fund. The Committee incorrectly used *Statement of Expenditures* (Disbursement Form 31-B) to report disbursements from the Political Party Restricted Fund for the June 30, 2011 semiannual reporting period. We footed the *Statement of Expenditures* (Disbursement Form 31-B) and the *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* (Disbursement Form 31-M), filed for 2011. We noted no computational errors. We recommend the Committee use the correct Form 31-M for all submissions.
2. Per Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.13(X)(1), we scanned Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Form 31-M filed for 2011 and inquired of management whether they transferred any cash from the restricted fund to any other political party account into which contributions may be made or from which contributions or expenditures may be made. We found no evidence of prohibited transfers.
3. We compared the amounts on checks or other disbursements reflected in 2011 restricted fund bank statements to disbursement amounts reported on Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Form 31-M filed for 2011. We found no discrepancies.
4. For each disbursement on Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Form 31-M filed for 2011, we traced the payee and amount to payee invoices and to the payee's name on canceled checks. The payees and amounts recorded on Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Forms 31-M agreed to the payees and amounts on the canceled checks and invoices.
5. We scanned the payee for each 2011 disbursement for evidence that it might represent a contribution or campaign-related disbursement, both of which Ohio Rev. Code, 3517.13(X)(2)(b), prohibit. We found no evidence that any restricted fund disbursements represented contributions or campaign-related disbursements.
6. We compared the signature on 2011 checks to the list dated September 14, 2011 of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. The signatory on all checks we selected was an approved signatory. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check without exception.
7. We scanned each 2011 restricted fund disbursement recorded on Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Form 31-M for evidence that it represented a transfer from the restricted fund to any other state or county political party, which Ohio Rev. Code 3517(X)(4) prohibits. We found no evidence of any transfers.

8. We compared the purpose of each disbursement listed on 2011 Disbursement Form 31-B and Disbursement Form 31-M to the purpose listed on the vendor invoice and to the purposes Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18 permits. We found no instances where the purpose described on the invoice violated the restrictions of Ohio Rev. Code, Section 3517.18.

We were not engaged to, and did not examine each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* and *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* filed for 2011, the objective of which would have been to opine on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.
