## Independent Accountants' Report on Applying Agreed-Upon Procedures

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM), on Dr. Vidula C. Khadiikar's (hereafter referred to as the Provider) compliance with the requirements of the Medicaid Provider Incentive Program (MPIP) for the year ended December 31, 2016. The Provider is responsible for compliance with the MPIP requirements. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of ODM. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures enumerated below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

1. We obtained the Provider's encounters during the patient volume attestation period. We scanned the list and found no duplicate encounters. We also found it included multiple payer sources.
2. We recalculated the Medicaid patient volume from the encounters identified in procedure 1 and confirmed the Provider met the 30 percent patient volume requirement.
3. We did not determine if the current electronic health record software was approved as the Provider did not participate in the MPIP program after program year 2016.
4. We obtained the Provider's equipped practice location during the meaningful use period and compared this to the location included in the meaningful use report. We found no exception.
5. We obtained supporting documentation for the 10 objectives and compared it to the applicable criteria. We found no differences for objective 1 and 3 through 10. We found for Objective 2, Measure 2 we received a vendor letter stating the drug and allergy interaction and formulary checks were enabled during 2016; however, we received no other documentation to show they were enabled during the meaningful use period on the Provider's EHR system.
6. For those measures that require only unique patients be counted, we scanned the detailed data and found no duplicates.
7. We obtained supporting documentation for the clinical quality measures and compared it to the applicable criteria. We confirmed the minimum number of measures was met with at least one measure from three different domains.

This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards. We were not engaged to and did not conduct an examination or review, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion or conclusion, respectively, on the Provider's compliance with the requirements of the Medicaid Provider Incentive Program. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported.
