I am the Chief Financial Officer of Lake County (the County), 105 Main Street, Painesville, Ohio 44077. This letter is in support of the County's use of the financial test to demonstrate financial assurance, as specified in chapter 3745-27 of the Administrative Code.

(1) The County is the owner or operator of the Lake County Sanitary Landfill, 2039 Blase/Nemeth Road, Painesville, Ohio 44077 for which financial assurance for final closure, post-closure care or corrective measures is demonstrated through the financial test specified in chapter 3745-27 of the Administrative Code and/or the County is the owner or operator of the following facilities for which financial assurance for any other environmental obligations are assured by a financial test. The current final closure, post-closure care, and/or corrective measures cost estimates, and any other environmental obligations provided for by a test are shown for each facility:

INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have audited, in accordance with Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the basic financial statements of Lake County, Ohio (the County) for the year ended December 31, 2009, and have separately issued our ungualified report thereon dated June 25, 2010. These statements present the landfill as a major enterprise fund and also within the County's businesstype activities.

In a letter to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency dated June 25, 2010 (the Letter), Edward Zupancic, Auditor for Lake County, of (including the County's sanitary landfill) specified that certain amounts disclosed in that Letter were derived from the independently audited financial statements referred to in the first paragraph above.

Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

As required by Ohio Administrative Code Sections 3745-27-15(L)(5)(c) and 3745-27-16(L)(5)(c), we have agreed the following amounts included in the Letter to the audited financial statements:

The amounts on line 6 agree to the basic fund financial statements of the County, or can be computed from amounts appearing therein. We followed the definition for line 6 included in the State Support Document for the Local Government Financial Test, issued November 27, 1996 by the USEPA. Line 5 includes total assured environmental costs reported in the fund financial statements following Governmental Accounting Statement Number 18.
