INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

Secretary of State of Ohio Republican Executive Committee Stark County 2727 Fulton Drive NW Canton, Ohio 44718

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, to which the Republican Executive Committee (the Committee) agreed, solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with certain requirements included in Ohio Rev. Code Sections 3517.1012, 3517.13(X)(1), 2(b), (3)(a), and (4), 3517.17, and 3517.18, for the year ended December 31, 2009. The Committee is responsible for complying with these requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements and applicable attestation engagement standards included in the Comptroller General of the United States' *Government Auditing Standards*. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Cash Receipts

- 1. We inquired of the Committee whether they deposited all gifts from corporations, labor organizations and all gifts restricted to operations into the same fund into which they deposit amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner. They informed us they did use this fund for all such gifts.
- We footed the online Restricted Fund Party Contribution/Deposit/Gift Details Statement Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.17 requires (obtained from the Secretary of State's website), filed for 2009. We noted no computational errors.
- 3. We compared bank deposits reflected in 2009 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in the online Restricted Fund *Party Contribution/Deposit/Gift Details Statement* completed for 2009. The bank deposit amounts agreed to the deposits recorded in the Statement
- 4. We scanned the Committee's 2009 bank statements and noted they reflected four quarterly payments received from the State Tax Commissioner pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code 3517.17(A). The online Restricted Fund Party Contribution/Deposit/Gift Details Statement reported the sum of these four payments without exception.
- 5. We scanned other recorded 2009 receipts for evidence that a corporation or labor organization may have exceeded the \$10,000 annual gift limit Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(3)(a) imposes. We found no evidence that any corporation or labor organization exceeded this limit.
- 6. Ohio Rev. Code 3517.1012 requires the Party to file forms electronically with the Secretary of State when the Committee receives gifts from corporations or labor organizations. We viewed the Restricted Fund *Party Contribution/Deposit/Gift Details Statement* submitted for 2009 on the Secretary of State's website.

Cash Reconciliation

- We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the December 31, 2009 reconciliation for the bank account used for receipts and disbursements restricted pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(A). We found no computational errors.
- 2. We agreed the bank balance on the reconciliation to the bank statement balance as of December 31, 2009. The balances agreed.
- 3. There were no reconciling items appearing on the reconciliation as of December 31, 2009.

Cash Disbursements

- 1. We footed each online Restricted Fund *Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement* Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.17 requires (obtained from the Secretary of State's website), filed for 2009. We noted no computational errors.
- 2. Per Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(1), we scanned the Restricted Fund Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement filed for 2009 and inquired of management whether they transferred any cash from the restricted fund to any other political party account into which contributions may be made or from which contributions or expenditures may be made. We found no evidence of prohibited transfers.
- 3. We compared the amounts on checks or other disbursements reflected in 2009 restricted fund bank statements to disbursement amounts reported on the Restricted Fund Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement filed for 2009. We found no discrepancies.
- 4. We selected all expenditures over \$400 from the Restricted Fund Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement filed for 2009, we traced the payee and amount to payee invoices and to the payee's name on canceled checks. The payees and amounts recorded on the Restricted Fund Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement agreed to the payees and amounts on the canceled checks and invoices.
- 5. We scanned the payee for each 2009 disbursement for evidence that it might represent a contribution or campaign-related disbursement, both of which Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(2)(b) prohibit. We found no evidence that any restricted fund disbursements represented contributions or campaign-related disbursements.
- 6. We compared the signature on 2009 checks to the list dated May 2, 2005 of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. The signatory on all checks we selected was an approved signatory. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check without exception.
- 7. We scanned each 2009 restricted fund disbursement recorded on the Restricted Fund *Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement* for evidence that it represented a transfer from the restricted fund to any other state or county political party, which Ohio Rev. Code 3517(X)(4) prohibits. We found no evidence of any transfers.
- 8. We compared the purpose of the disbursements we selected in step 3 above listed on 2009 Restricted Fund *Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement* to the purpose listed on the vendor invoice and to the purposes Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18 permits. We found no instances where the purpose described on the invoice violated the restrictions of Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18.

 Ohio Rev. Code 3517.1012 requires the Party to file forms electronically with the Secretary of State when the Committee receives gifts from corporations or labor organizations. We viewed the Restricted Fund *Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement* submitted for 2009 on the Secretary of State's website.

We were not engaged to, and did not examine each Restricted Fund *Party Contribution/Deposit/Gift Details Statement* and Restricted Fund *Party Disbursement/Expenditure Details Statement* filed for 2009, the objective of which would have been to opine on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.
